



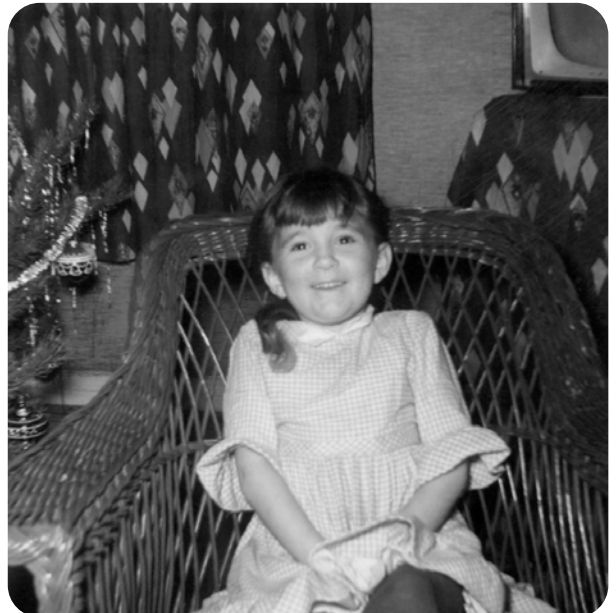
Jeremiah 29:11-14


